Indenture between Ambrose Jenks of Stanway Clerke and Jane his wife (1) and Thomas Vade of Barton-on-the Heath Gent and Francis Smyth of Chipping Campden Gent (2) of the properties now or heretofore in possession of Anne Whiteing Widow, William Sellard, William Saunders, Samuel Page, Padwick, William Blackley, William Blackley heretofore in the possession of William Adams, Michael Bravell, the property in the several possessions of Jonas Howell and Richard Jasketts the three properties now or heretofore of Alice Payne Widow, Abraham Knight, Elizabeth Bats Widow, and Richard Padwicke; Robert Davenport formerly of John Heapy; Robert Warde, Thomas Lucas, John Boulton, John Willis, John Lea, Elizabeth James and John Fisher, Orisigond Jelkes, Elizabeth Harris, Widow, Susanna Stephens, Widow, Thomas Clements, Christopher Harrison, William Dorward and Robert Dorward, Anne Simpkins Widow, Peter Walker, Elizabeth Coleman Widow, her house and close, Wormington, Widow Fowler, Phillip Hitchman, Katherine Jempson Widow, Ambrose Haseler, Thomas Bravell, John Goold, Humphry Taynton, John Willis, Nicholas Tomlins, William Gibbard, Richard Horseman, Thomas Lardiman, John Niblit, Thomas Bason alias Butcher, part of the 18/- rent from the house of William Hurleston, Richard Harthill, Roger Weoly, Edmund Hancox, William Freeman, Ralph Tutty, part of the 4/- rent from the house of William Mayo, part of rent from property of Ambrose Jenks in possession of John Perrin. Granted by patent of James I 25th September 1609 to Francis Norris of Westminster Esq. and Francis Phellips of London Gent. The properties have come to Ambrose Jenks who sells

to Thomas Wade and Francis Smyth to the benefit of Margery now wife of Francis Smyth for

her natural life and then to Francis Smyth his heirs and assigns.
