- Local History now and then (*but does that clash with the remit for the main CCHS talks?*)

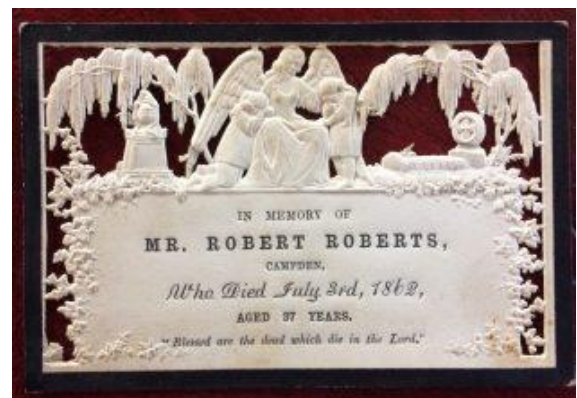

From the Archives: Memorial Cards



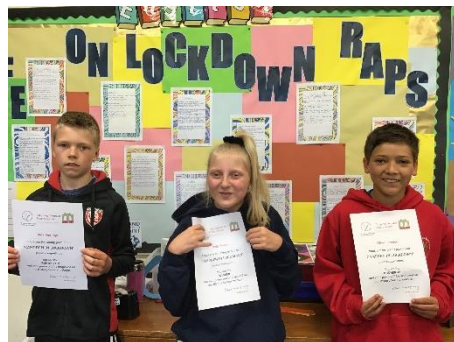
We are currently cataloguing a donation of papers and photographs from the late Edwin Ladbrook, whose father and uncle (Lawrence

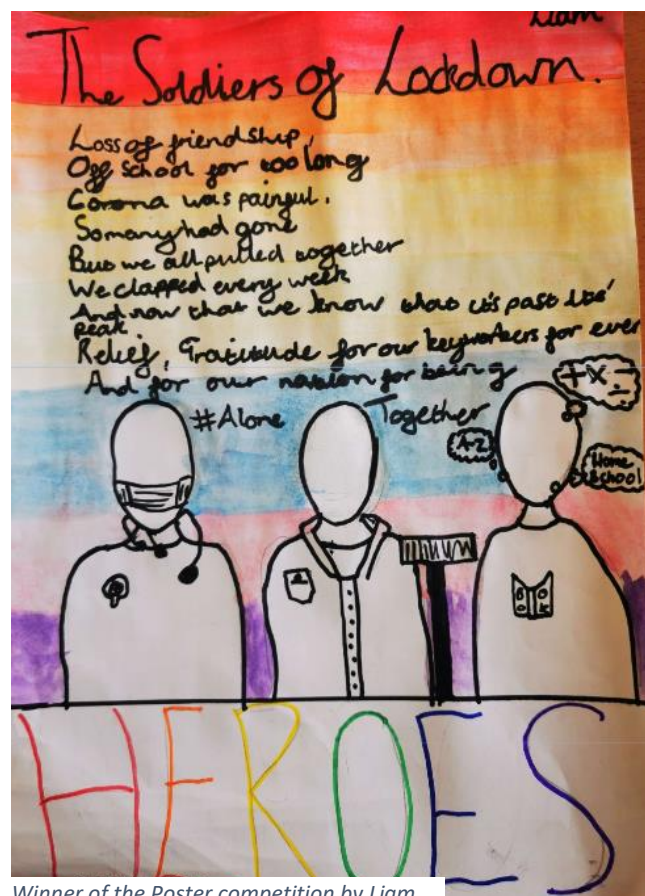
Schools' "Lockdown" Competition
