## GEORGE STRATHEARN





Very little personal information can be found about George Strathearn, but the cap badge was a start in tracing his history. The cap badge was confirmed as that of the Royal Scots, and a search of the Medal Roll Index Cards found his details.

He was a Private in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Royal Scots who enlisted on 23<sup>rd</sup> October 1914. This early enlistment entitled him to the 1914 Star.

In addition he was awarded the British and Victory medals for action in a theatre of war. The Clasp and Roses was instituted in 1919 and awarded to those who had operated within range of enemy mobile artillery between 5<sup>th</sup> August and 22<sup>nd</sup> November 1914.
